Get ready. Get Set. Learn! Bud Fagan is a new teacher to the Glendo School family. He moved to Glendo from Centennial, Wyoming where he taught ages K-6. During his twenty-eight years of teaching, Mr. Fagan has won Teacher of the Year in Georgia and in Centennial. He enjoys incorporating hands-on learning experiences for the students. Studies show that hands-on learning increas-

For a hands-on learning experience, Mr. Fagan likes to take students to Teton Science School in Kelly, Wyoming. This September Glendo students, 4th-8th grade, will get to visit Teton Science School. "The trip is about a week long," said

Fagan. "They will stay three nights and four days." This is the first time Glendo students will have the opportunity to go to the Teton Science School!

Students will experience many activities including hiking, snow shoeing, and cross country skiing. They will study geology, geothermal activity, snow glaciers, species studies, and conservation services. Students will study the

geology of the Gros Ventre (groh-VAHNT) landslide and how the earth gave way to the enormous crater that we see today. Students will also be going for a sleigh ride on the Elk Reserve. They will learn about the challenges of managing the herds and what problems arise when man intervenes.

When asked about the cost of sending a student to Teton Science School Mr. Fagan

replied, "It costs \$420 per student which covers the program fee, meals and lodging." To help with the cost, Glendo PTO will be raffling off a Ruger Hawkeye FTW Hunter 6.5 Creedmoor Bolt Action Rifle-Stainles/Silver, 24 inch, 4 rounds with a value of \$1400, a half of beef valued at \$1270. and a custom fire pit made by the Ag Students valued at \$500. Raffle tickets will go on sale starting February 15, 2024 and the winners will be drawn on April 15, 2024. Tickets are one for \$20 or six for \$100. "It's a great hands-on learning experience," replied Fagan, "something the student's will remember forever."

In November the community was told that the Downey well was experiencing problems and was being fixed by Todd Taylor from Eagle Drilling. During the January Town Council meeting Mayor Juska was asked for an update on the Downey well, "We are still working on parts through Todd Taylor," she said, "But he is having a hard time finding parts to repair or replace the pump."

Upon further investigation it was found that Taylor was able to easily find the pump and the pipe, but was unable to find the rest of the parts that were needed. When asked why he had been experiencing such difficulty Taylor replied, "We are being told that these parts are no longer manufactured in the United States. They have to ship them overseas. I talked



A huge thank you goes out to Basin Electric. Larry Collins, and Eagle Drilling for helping Glendo get the Downey well up and running.


Words of Wisdom:

Registering to Vote for the Municipal Election

The last day to register to vote in the Municipal Election is April 23, 2024. After this date you will need to both register and vote absentee at the Glendo Town Hall, or you may register and vote at the polls on Election Day, May 7, 2024.

Campaign Finance Reporting

Campaign finance reports must be filed between the dates of April 23, and April 30, 2024. Pursuant to Wyoming State Statute (W.S.) §22-25-106, amendments to this report must be filed no later than 5:00 PM on May 17, 2024. Candidates for Municipal offices must file their reports with the Town Clerk at Glendo Town Hall.

Voting Assistance

Any elector who requires assistance to vote because of blindness, disability or inability to read or write, may be given assistance by a person of the elector's choice, other than the elector's employer or agent of that employer or an officer or agent of the elector's union (W.S. §22-13-113(a)). If you have any questions regarding the accessibility of your polling place, please contact the Office of the County Clerk by calling (307)322-2315 or emailing pcelection@plattecountywyoming.com.

Absentee Voting


Except for Municipal election day (May 7, 2024), a qualified elector may request an absentee ballot from the Glendo Town Hall, starting as early as April 9, 2024. To vote on election day, qualified electors must obtain a ballot at their designated polling location. Identification Required to Vote

Recent changes to Wyoming law require that every voter show acceptable identification at the polls to receive a ballot to vote. Forms of identification accepted at the polls are listed here: https://sos.wyo.gov/Elections/VoterID/Default.aspx. Voters who are unable to produce acceptable identification will be provided a provisional ballot. Provisional ballots are not counted unless a voter is able to provide acceptable identification to the Town Clerk's Office by 5:00 PM of the day following the election.


