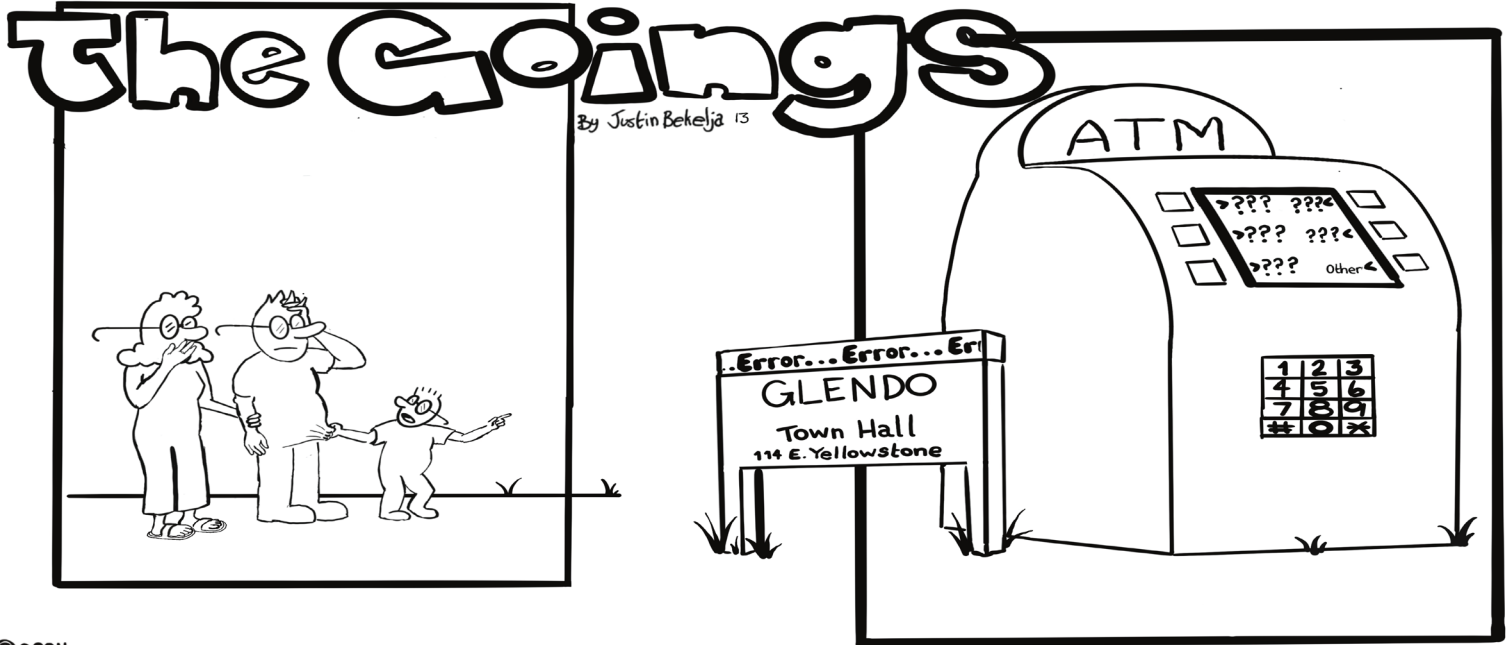

Town of Glendo Under Investigation

The Town of Glendo is under investigation due to a report of “Suspicious charges and money handling,” according to Platte County Sheriff David Russell. Upon receiving the report in July, Sheriff Russell assigned the case to a part-time investigator previously employed by DCI.

During Glendo’s Town Council meeting on Aug. 14, Mayor Susan Juschka confirmed the investigation, stating, “Tristany Hoffman has been terminated as our Clerk/Treasurer. It is an ongoing investigation through the sheriff’s office because of some bank anomalies.”

The Platte County Sheriff’s office has been gathering information and has applied for search warrants to view bank records and other documents. When asked how long it could take, Sheriff Russell said the goal is for the investigation to be complete within a couple of weeks,

depending on when the bank information is received.

With the clerk/treasurer position open, the town’s assistant clerk, Kelsey Crabtree, has stepped into the head clerk position in the interim.

On July 10 Glendo Town Council held their monthly meeting. Council member Kelly Jones was sworn into office.

Water Project: Dan Dugdale reported, "The water project, a million-dollar grant project, is basically wrapped up. We have to do some concrete work and move one fire hydrant." Dave Coffey confirmed they met with WyoDak and performed the substantial completion walk-through. "Dan brought for public viewing, some examples of why we need to replace your water system. These are some great examples of different kinds of pipes that are put together with various kinds of metal that are nicely corroding within your streets. This is a great project. I'm glad the town is getting some help from Water Development Commission to get that master plan done. This is a good move for the town in the right direction for public health and safety," said Dave Coffey. Josh Miller, co-owner of WyoDak thanked the council for hiring them to do the project, he also discussed possible surface mitigation options. Miller had an inquiry about when they would receive payment. The Town of Glendo has not yet received the check from the state. The town does not have the funds to write WyoDak a check, "We didn't have the funds," said Dan Dugdale, "that was the purpose of the

million-dollar grant."

Dan Dugdale reported, "The master plan that we've been working on for the last two years from rural water is substantially completed." A public meeting will be held where the master plan will be presented to the community. "It was agreed that they will publish that meeting in advance in the Merchant because everybody in this community gets the Merchant in their mailbox," said Dugdale. Mayor Juschka added, "They'll be posted around town, also on the website. Thanks." Dugdale went on to ask head of maintenance, Steve Eller about the estimate from Badger for jetting the sewer lines. Eller hasn't had a response from Badger, Councilwoman Jones offered to go talk to them in Casper. Dugdale also mentioned that the Downey well's pressure gauge needs to be changed.

Dan Dugdale on behalf of Heather Schoning: "She had brought up during the last meeting, about some of the properties that needed to be cleaned up, and evidently we're mowing one of them, or did mow one of them? She wanted to make sure we were billing them and wanted to know what we were billing them." The Mayor responded by saying, "The lady personally hired, Steve." Steve Eller responded, "I didn't mow it, I weed-whacked it and it was basically

on my time."

Mayor Juschka: "I like to thank everyone who helped us and assisted us with the Glendo Days. It went off really well. It was very successful and well attended. I think everybody had a really good time. We received really nice thank you note from the Anderson family, for helping set up the tent at the park, Steve did that, thank you."

Tristany Hoffman reported that she and Steve will be taking the water test again. Hoffman mentioned that Kelsey, the assistant clerk, is interested in taking some grant writing classes. Councilwoman Jones mentioned that she had a few resources that they could use.

Ordinance 273: Transient Travel Merchant replacing 267 Vendor Ordinance had its third and final reading: The permit will be a season pass from May 15 to October 15. The season pass would cost twenty-five dollars. Vendors will fill out an application and comply with Wyoming State Laws regarding selling their wares. The council allowed comments on the ordinance. There were no comments from the public. Ordinance 273 passed.

Curtis Fields' building permit for a shed on the back corner of his property was passed.

Tom Krizan gave an update on the EMS Golf Benefit that was held at the end of June. 104 people came to play golf but they had over 140 people show up to support and donate. "We grossed around \$13,200 after expenses they will be able to write checks to the EMS and the Fire Department for \$5,600." He wanted to thank all who helped and volunteered, especially, "Bob Ruwart Motors for the potential giveaway of the pickup truck, we had to follow all PGA rules, and they were real stringent. Jim Ludvig for allowing us to put it on his property."

Liquor Licenses: The town moved into a public hearing to hear any concerns regarding the liquor licenses for Anglers Rest, Old Western, and Frontier Flame (transfer from Kims). There were no concerns or questions. Council approved all three liquor licenses.

Words of Wisdom: Glendo Meditation

Busyness seems to be a way of life, yet summer gives us a way of getting outside and recreating. A time to relax, refresh, and re-create ourselves. Before we get all wrapped up into buying school supplies and clothes for our kids and grandkids, before we finish the haying, before preparing stock for shipping and sale, or whatever else is on your plate, let us take a pause.

Jesus even suggested this to his apostles after their return from a successful mission trip.

The apostles gathered around Jesus and told him all they had done and taught. He said to them, "Come away to a deserted place all by yourselves and rest a while." For many were coming and going, and they had no leisure even to eat. And they went away in a boat to a deserted place by themselves. Matthew 6:30-32

So, take a pause and rest a while. Get in a boat and find a deserted place, a sacred space, a place to be with God. Sit in that boat and listen to the water lapping against its sides. Relax on a shady lakeside and let the breeze refresh your soul. Listen to the symphony of songs orchestrated by the birds gathered along a stream or river. You may find your peace

sitting in a flower garden as the bees are busy among the flowers. Or wonder and awe may fill you as you watch a sunrise or sunset, or pondering life looking at the full moon.

The mountains may be more to your liking, as they were to John Muir. Muir had a unique perspective about being in the mountains. He said, "Hiking I do not like the word or the thing. People ought to saunter in the mountains not hike! Do you know the origin of that word "saunter?" It's a beautiful word. Back in the Middle Ages people used to go on pilgrimages to the Holy Land, when people in the villages through which they passed asked where they were going, they would reply, 'A la sainte terre,' 'to the Holy Land.' And so they became known as saint-terre-ers or saunterers. Now the mountains are our Holy Land and we ought to saunter through them reverently, not 'hike' through them."

So, go. Find your sacred space. And "Be still, and know that I am God." Psalm 46:10

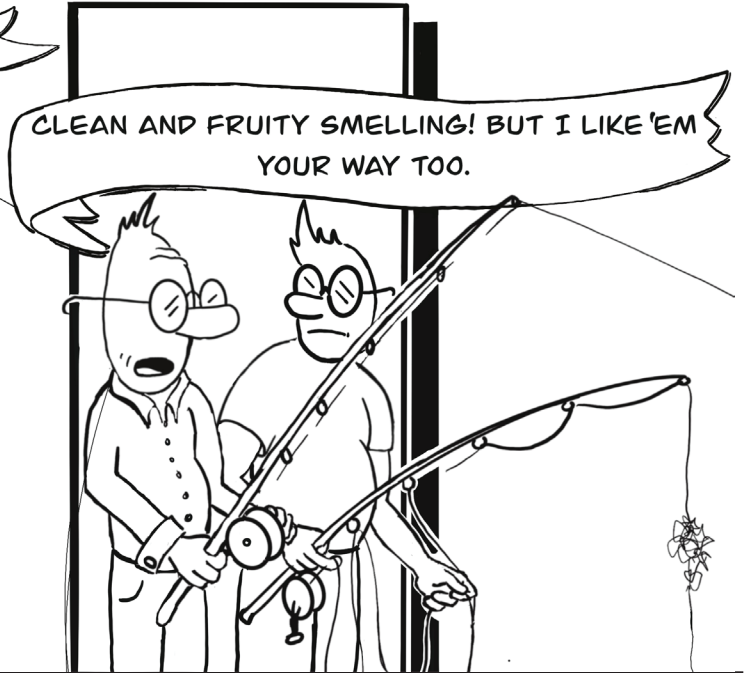
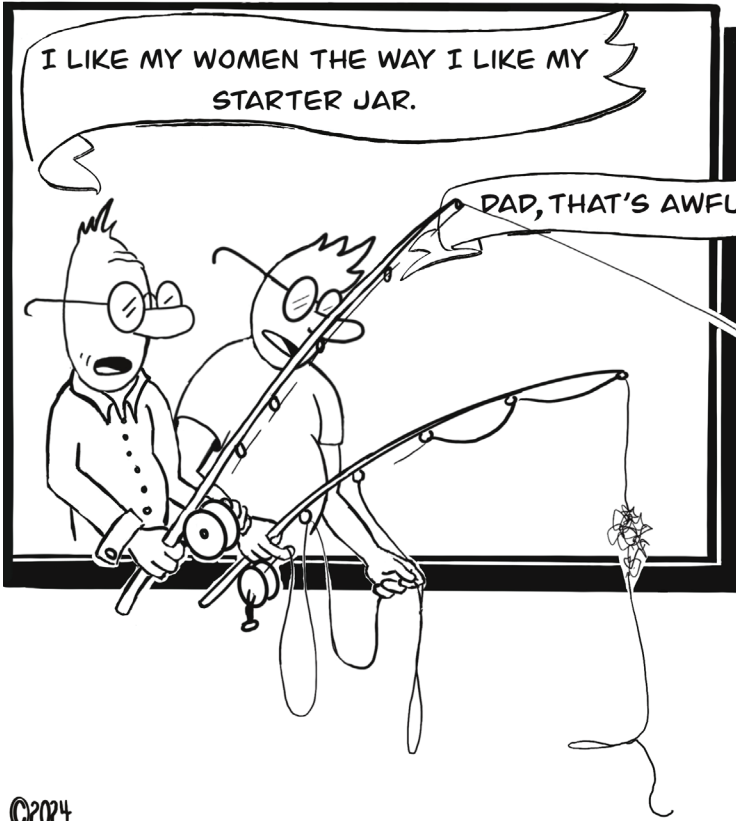
